RE Curriculum

Intent	Our intent is provide opportunities to reflect on our experience of the world and the beliefs, values and
	attitudes that guide us through life. RE helps pupils (and the school as a whole) to reflect on the ways in which
	beliefs influence how people live their lives. We want children to explore how their experiences, beliefs and
	values are the same and different to others. The curriculum is designed to be taught in a way that is sensitive to
	the needs of all pupils, regardless of their faith or belief. It is also designed to be relevant to the lives of pupils.
Implementation	Our whole curriculum is shaped by our school vision which aims to create a positive, safe and nurturing
	environment, where everyone belongs and is encouraged to shine and become the best they can be. We teach
	the SACRE Syllabus in weekly RE lessons. Lessons include discussion, role-play, problem solving, creative
	activities, visitors to school and field trips. Children are encouraged to ask questions. Lessons are adapted so
	that all children can access the learning and be challenged.
Impact	By the time children leave Newtown School they will be able to:
	 Show a basic knowledge and understanding of Christianity and Islam
	Ask questions
	 Reflect on personal experience and say how it is linked to feelings and opinions
	 Appreciate the experiences, feelings, and opinions of others.
